Andy Devine, raspy-voiced comedian of the films, comes to the Music Hall to visit Bing Crosby next Thursday at 9 p.m. over WEAF. Devine's falsetto whisperings will provide plenty of fun, but little competition for Bing and the Hall regulars, which include as usual, the Music Maids and Phil, the Charioteers, Ken Carpenter and John Scott Trotter.


