Bus, Truck Threatened, Gillette Says

WASHINGTON—(U.P.)—Sen. Guy M. Gillette (D-Ia.) said Wednesday that plans have been "seriously advanced within the last two weeks to take all bus and truck traffic off the roads" because of the rubber shortage.
A spokesman for Rubber Director William M. Jeffers said the rubber shortage is "more acute than most people think" but that he knew of no plans to take trucks and buses off the roads. He conceded, however, that he could envisage such a step if the rubber shortage is aggravated materially.
Gillette, chairman of a senate agriculture subcommittee investigating the synthetic rubber program, said "representatives of various governmental agencies much concerned with war production" recently have asked him to undertake "open, active development of the synthetic rubber and alcohol picture."

He made the statement in opening a hearing before the subcommittee.
The rubber situation, he said, is "even more critical" now than when the subcommittee suspended hearings last summer.
Sen. Charles L. McNary (R-Ore.) said War Production Board Chairman Donald M. Nelson sent him exact data several months ago showing "large exports of raw and finished rubber" to South America and Canada.
AFL to Oppose Wage-Hour Change
MIAMI, Fla.—(U.P.)—William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, said Wednesday the executive council of the union would oppose any attempt of the 78th congress to modify or repeal the wage-hour act.
"Any proposals that are made to lengthen the 40-hour work week are designed merely to reduce wages," Green declared.
Axis Loses 13 Ships, London Declares
LONDON—(U.P.)—The admiralty reported Wednesday night that British naval forces had sunk 13 Axis ships in the central Mediterranean in the past three days.
