OST popular sports have M grown up step by step through the ages, but basket-ball is different. It is less than 52 years old, and we know when and how it was started. When James Naismith was


given charge of a "gym" class at the Y. W. C. A. school in Springfield, Mass., he felt there would have to be a change of some sort. The students had not liked the class.

invent? At the start, he tried to make an indoor sport of Rugby football, but met failure. Even with changed rules, football was, too rough to
