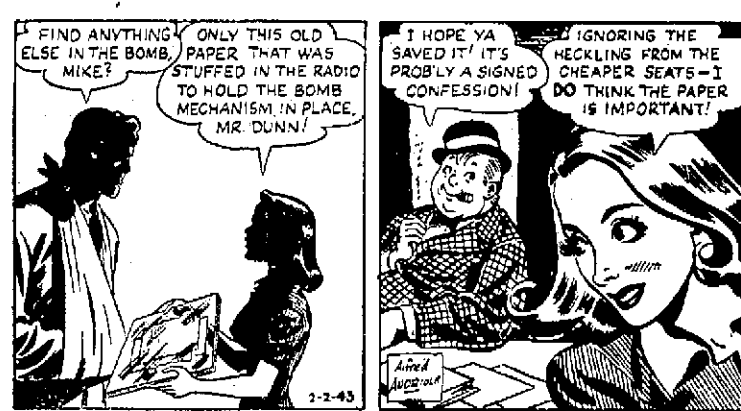
WOODCHUCK IS SIZE OF HOUSE CAT BUT FATTER
ONE of my early memories of the first time my father told me about "groundhog day." He spoke of the legend which said there would be six weeks of bad weather if the ground hog saw its shadow. He laughed as he spoke, and I suppose he did not believe the legend, but I—a lad only four years of age—listened with great interest.

The animal which gave its name to the day is the "ground hog," perhaps better described as a "woodchuck."
The woodchuck, or ground hog, is a digging animal. With the sharp claws of its front feet, it cuts into the soil. The hind feet are used to kick the loose dirt backward while the digging is going on.
The woodchuck tunnel is usually between 10 and 25 feet long. The animal digs on a sharp slant to a depth of perhaps three feet, then goes almost parallel with the surface of the ground. At the end of the tunnel it cuts out a room which is large enough for it to use in turning round. That is the room where woodchucks make nests for their young.
Sometimes extra tunnels are made to and from the underground room. These tunnels help woodchucks to escape from enemies.
A woodchuck tunnel may lead to two or more rooms, and different members of the family may have separate rooms. In winter, however, it is best for them to "snuggle together" to keep warm.
A woodchuck is about the size of a house cat, but it is fatter than
