WHEN he visited the Peabody home, Nathaniel Hawthorne met the sister of the young woman who had invited him to come to see her. The sister was named Sophia, and when Hawthorne caught sight of her, he had a hard time taking his eyes from her face.

Sophia Peabody at that time was an invalid, and could not leave her own home, but her face seemed noble and beautiful to the writer who had kept himself penned away from the world. There was in his own mind a memory of years in his boyhood when, after injuring his leg, he had been confined to his home.
