Gale Sondergaard is a smoldering brunette suspect; Lee Patrick, an amorous blonde one! OHIO Bringing together for the first time two top stars of the screen, Ginger Rogers and Cary Grant, offers a stirring glimpse of love against a world at war in Leo McCarey's "Once Upon a Honeymoon" at the Ohio.

Using as his theme the light-hearted, gay type of romantic sparring for which he is famous, McCarey has invested his picture with gipping dramatic meaning by backgrounding it against Nazi world-ambitions in Europe and

the successive sweeps into Austria and Poland and France.

Grant plays the part of an American newspaper correspondent and broadcaster, watching interestedly as the situation comes to a crisis. Miss Rogers is cast as an American dancer in Europe who succumbs to the glamor of a suave German baron and marries him, despite the advice of the newspaperman, just as Austria falls to Hitler.

Interested in the Baroness personally and in the Baron because things begin to happen whenever he goes to a new country, the newspaperman follows the two around, lands in Warsaw with them just as the Polish blitz begins, and finally convulses the Baroness that her husband is a clever Nazi agent and not the type of man she should stay married to.

Pretending to have been killed in the bombing of Warsaw, the Baroness helps a Jewish maid escape from the Gestapo and with the maid's passport and the help of the newspaperman, reaches Holland when the Nazis strike that country the two Americans flee into France, and are in Paris when that city falls.

There the girl and her titled husband come together under dramatic circumstances, and a web of intrigue entangles the three principals, with patriotism driving both Americans into making sacrifices for their country until Fate takes a hand in settling matters for a satisfactory ending.

Along with the romance, their roles give the two stars opportunities for suspenseful dramatic action, and their portrayals are said to be the best they have ever turned in. Walter Slezak noted Viennese actor, makes his American screen debut in the part of the double-dealing Baron, and Albert Dekker, Ferike Boros, Albert Basserman and Harry Shannon head the supporting cast.

LYRIC A grand surprise package of entertainment, as heart-warming as a letter from home, will delight moviegoers here beginning Saturday night when "The Postman Didn't Ring," new romantic comedy, arrives at the Lyric theatre.

Starring beautiful Brenda Joyce and newcomer Richard Travis, the film purports to tell how a whole town is thrown on its ear by the arrival of a momentous letter — fifty years overdue.

The missive was intended for Richard Travis' father, but was lost with others in a notorious mail robbery before the turn of the century. How the mail sack is recovered and its fateful contents disclosed makes for outstanding entertainment.
