LYRIC
The problem of what to do "The Night Before The Divorce" is neatly and entertainingly solved by Lynn Bari and Joseph Allen, Jr., in the film of the same name due Tuesday at the Lyric.

Swiftly moving thru a series of riotous escapades involving Lynn and Joe in a divorce, murder, and an escape from the clutches of the law, "The Night Before The Divorce" is sheer fun with plenty of laughs.

Joe and Lynn are mixed up in a marital misunderstanding which threatens their happy home life. It seems that Lynn is the superior type, so Joe finds success in the affections of luscious Mary Beth Hughes, who gives him the "great, big, beautiful man" approach.

Joe wears the same suit throughout the picture, the first time in years he has been able to get by on a minimum wardrobe. The suit, however, has two stand-ins, duplicates. One the actor ruined in fight scenes and the other was retired to the old clothes closet after Aherne played a long sequence crawling on his stomach.

Loretta Young's dresses, few and simple, were principally of new wartime materials. One suit was of a new processed paper. The cast features the Hollywood's oldest actor, Old Hickory, a turtle, native of the Galapagos Isles, and 120 years ago.

The names of Jeff Donnell and Lee Patrick in the cast will confuse some. Both are young women. Jeff, in a brief but telling role, turns on hysterics for her third consecutive picture—and well. She is a brunette. Miss Patrick, equally striking but blonde, plays a night club hostess.

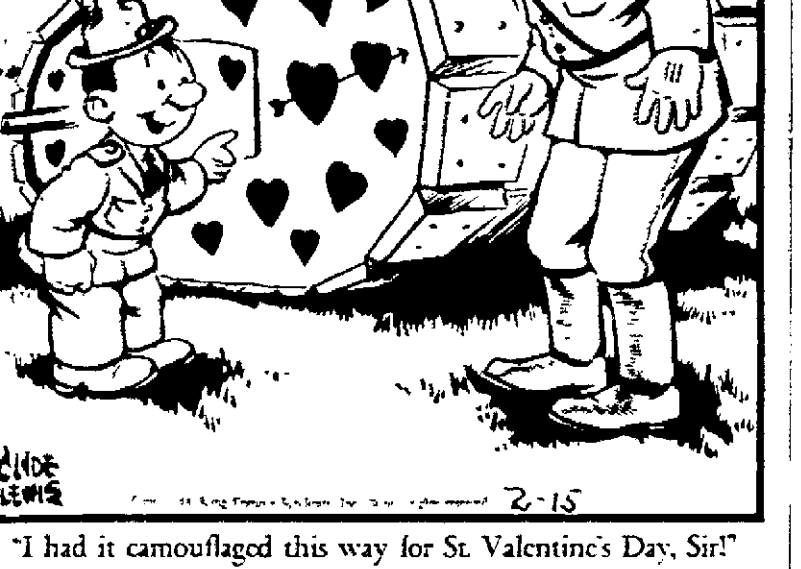

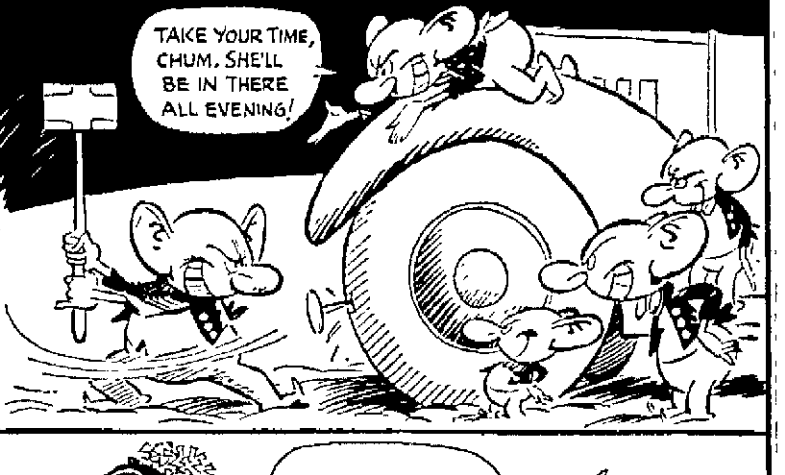
