**Defoe Talked With Selkirk Before Writing "Robinson Crusoe"**

When Daniel Defoe was led to the pillory, he was about 42 years of age. The hours he spent in the pillory played a part in bringing back freedom of the press to England. Seeing that the prisoner was cheered by the crowd, officers of the government decided it might be a mistake to punish a writer in that way.

Defoe was known to the London public at that time, but his fame had not spread very far. For the most part he had spent his time writing pamphlets about politics and religion.

In later years, Defoe became more busy with his pen. Month after month, year after year he kept on turning out new books and pamphlets. Sometimes he used a "pen name" instead of his own. In other cases he left out any mention of the name of the author.

No one knows the exact number of his books, long and short, but it seems there were at least 180 of them and possibly as many as 250. Several proved of special importance, being very well written and well received by the public.

One of Defoe's books was "The Journal of the Plague Year." Another was "Captain Singleton" and still another had the odd title of "The Political History of the Devil."

Of all the works of Defoe, no other can compare with the one he called "The Life and Strange Surprising Adventures of Robinson Crusoe." It was published in 1719, and went through four printings in the first four months. Since then the story has gone through hundreds of printings and new editions, and it is commonly known to the world by the simple title of "Robinson Crusoe."

The idea for "Robinson Crusoe" seems to have come to Defoe from talks he had with a Scottish sailor named Alexander Selkirk. This sailor he met in Bristol, and from his lips he heard strange news of life on a desert island. Selkirk had been on the island for four years and four months.

In writing the story of "Robinson Crusoe," Defoe made many changes from the account which came from Selkirk's lips. He spoke of an island north of South America instead of west of that continent, and he added many adventures which Selkirk never had. To a large extent, "Robinson Crusoe" is a work of fiction, but there is a good deal of truth mixed with the fiction.
