The idea for "Robinson Crusoe" seems to have come to Defoe from talks he had with a Scottish sailor named Alexander Selkirk. This sailor he met in Bristol, and from his lips he heard strange news of life on a desert island. Selkirk had been on the island for four years and four months. In writing the story of "Robin-

son Crusoe," Defoe made many changes from the account which came from Selkirk's lips. He spoke of an island north of South America instead of west of that continent, and he added many adven-tures which Selkirk never had. To a large extent, "Robinson Crusoe" is a work of fiction, but there is a good deal of truth mixed with the
