

Joe E. Brown Bowls And Traps Nazi Spies On Lyric Screen

New Mystery-Comedy Completes Bill Opening Tuesday; "The Hard Way" Continues At The Ohio

Coming Tuesday to the Lyric is "The Daring Young Man," in which Joe E. Brown portrays a champion bowler and a big mouthed comedian who helps trap a band of Nazi spies. Pretty Marguerite Chapman also has a leading role. A new mystery-comedy, "Whispering Ghosts," also will show Tuesday. Ending Monday are "It Happened in Flat-bush" and "Outlaws of Boulder Pass."

Those who saw "The Hard Way," at the Ohio theatre over the week-end termed it one of the finest pictures to show in Lima in recent weeks. Starring Ida Lupino, lovely Joan Leslie and Dennis Morgan, it tells about a girl who will do anything to make her sister nappy.

Thrills galore are found in "Eyes of the Underworld," at the Sigma which features hard-boiled Richard Dix and alluring Wendy Barrie. The co-feature, "When Johnny Comes Marching Home," a first class musical, stars Allan Jones, Jane Frazee, Gloria Jean and a host of other favorites.

Currently flashing on the screen at the State is "For Me and My Gal," a film in which Judy Garland has her first adult role. She plays a singer in this poignant love romance set against the glittering background of vaudeville in its heyday. "Scattergood Survives Murder," with Guy Kibbee, completes the program.
