KUFRA IS OASIS AREA IN MIDST OF LIBYAN DESERT

If you look at a map of Libya, you should be able to locate the city of Bengasi quickly, but I doubt that you will find Kufra. It is in the midst of the desert, 600 miles south of Bengasi.

Most maps do not show Kufra, but it has been for many years a center of Moslem power.

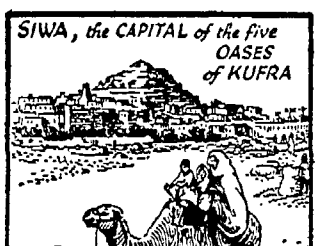
Kufra is not a city—it is an area which contains five oases. In the oases are little cities or villages. Together they contain only about 7,000 persons, but in the middle of the desert 7,000 people have a special importance.

It is hard to reach Kufra because of the great stretches of loose sand which must be crossed to reach it. For this reason, few persons from Europe have been there.

Going back into the past, we find that a German traveler visited Kufra in 1879. In 1916 a Frenchman was held prisoner for a time by the natives, then was set free.

When Italy took Libya from Turkey, the Berbers and Arabs in Kufra did not admit any change in their government. Many years passed before Italian soldiers were able to get anywhere near the oases.

The time did come, however, when a small group of Italians made their way toward Kufra. That was in December, 1928.



The journey took place after a message came to the Italians from Kufra? If you do that, we can talk over a treaty at the same time."

Capt. Aldro Fornari was placed in charge of the party which set out for Kufra. With him went a doctor and a wireless operator. The wireless operator hoped to send back news of a treaty, but what a surprise was to come to him and the others!

Mohammed Senoussi had promised to send a caravan to the most southern Italian outpost, and this was done. The chief, himself, and his two sons came with the caravan, and the son who was sick was treated at once by the doctor.
