

2. GARBAGE COLLECTING

Every person, association of person, firm or corposition engaged in the business of collecting and transporting garbage through the public streets of the City of Lima. Ohio, said garbage having been obtained from the residential districts of the City of Lima. Ohio, shall pay the annual license fee therefor, of One Dollar (\$1.00) and shall comply with all the provisions of Ordinance No. 13-40, passed January 29, 1946, entitled "An Ordinance regulating the collection and disposition of garbage and waste materials within the City of Lima, Ohio," logether with all other lawful requirements and orders of the Board of Health, its officers and agents.

Section 2 That existing Section S of Ordinance No. 1751 passed September 24, 1923, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
Section 3 That for the reason set forth in the preamble hereor, which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force forthwith.
