RENO, Nev., (U.P.) — OPA representative Dr. Rex Arlo Cridler has ruled to give babies a break in the matter of diapers. His ruling is that in "rented baby pants," the baby is entitled to a reasonable thing in them without its parents being penalized. The laundries, who are not permitted, he holds, to make deductions for "reasonable wear and tear" when the rented diapers are returned, nor can they exact a deposit higher than the ceiling price for diapers rented.
