Ayrshire Group Gathers In Advance Of Biggest Sale Of Year

More than 100 members of the Mid-West Ayrshire Breeders -assn and their guests, most of them wealthy cattlemen from five states and Canada, attended the association's dinner-meeting Friday evening In the Bair hotel,

The assemblage represented i the advance guard of thousands of breeders and cattle dealers who attended the Buckeye Ayrshire Farm dispersal auction sale all day Saturday seven miles west of Lima on Stale Route 117.

The dairy notables were attracted here by announcement of the auctioning of a prize six-yearold show bull, "Glengarry Sir Burton," imported, and 175 head of other eattle. The sale was heralded as the biggest of the year in this section of the coun-

T. C. Conklin, secretary of the Ayrshire Breeders-assn of Amer-Ica from Brandon, Vt., told the breeders that American cattlemen are showing intent interest in making products of the cow a global industry. The cow, he said, is the only adequate source of dairy products in the world. America, he said, is the only country that can produce in this field over and above its needs. R. D. biggest breeders and dealers in Canada and owner of the Glen Campbell Farms at Dundas, Ontario, brought greetings from the Canadian association. 
