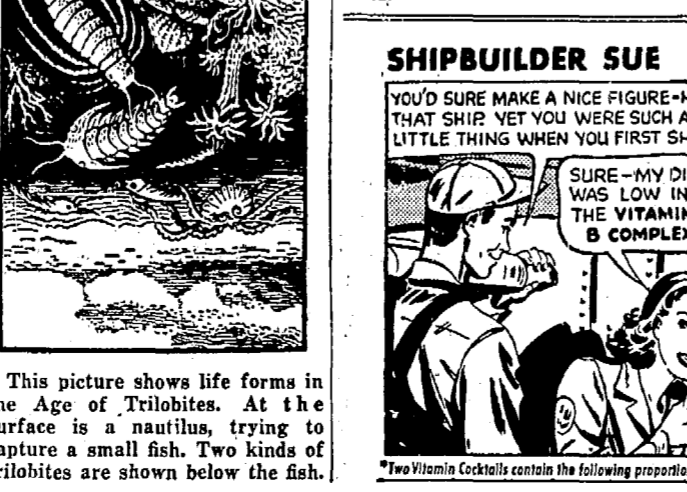

Uncle Ray's Corner

LEGS OF TRILOBITES DIFFERED GREATLY IN NUMBER YESTERDAY we spoke of amoebas, the tiny one-celled creatures which are believed to have been the first form of animal life on earth. There are two facts about amoebas which I want to add. One is that they divide after reaching a certain size. Some of the larger ones become as much as a sixteenth of an inch, wide, and can be seen without the help of a microscope. Another point is this: After dividing a number of times, an amoeba may join with a different one. They come together and form a single animal. This seems to make up for a weakness which is felt after they have divided too often.

Scientists believe the first living things were one-celled plants and one-celled animals. If that is true, the amoebas we find in pond mud today may be like those which existed at, or near, the dawn of life on this planet. Sad to say, the amoebas had no bones or shells to leave for us to find in rocks. That explains why fossils of them are not to be located. Deep down in the rock layers, however, we do find the remains of several kinds of simple animals. These include sponges and corals. The hard substance known as "coral" is a kind of skeleton, left by animals which died in the sea. Sponges also are animals, even though they grow in one place as if they were plants. That early age of life is called the "Cambrian period." Another name for it is the "Age of Trilobites."
