on library space. They said cost experts estimate the expense of maintaining one foot of shelving in a public library at between \$1 and \$2 a year.

"Who Was Who" saves more than six feet of shelving, they said, because it contains listings of dead persons included in 22 volumes of "Who's Who."

The new 1,406-page book names 27,457 deceased notables. The publishing officials said an average of 800 celebrities die each year, and their names will be added to a second edition of "Who Who" to be issued about 10 years from now.

Confined to great Americans, the first "Who Was Who" spans the period from the Civil War to the present. The original "Who's Who" biographies reassembled in "Who Was Who" usually were revised personally by those sketched. Consequently, many of them are autobiographical curiosities.

Japs Open Drive on British in Burma

NEW DEHLI -(U.P.)- In an effort to thrust back the British push toward Aykab, vital enemy base in western Burma, before the heavy spring rains set in, Japanese troops have opened a fierce counter-attack in the Rathedaung area, 25 miles to the northwest, a headquarters communique said today.

The fighting is continuing but the attacks have been repulsed and Japanese casualties in killed and wounded, as well as in equipment lost, were reported heavy.


