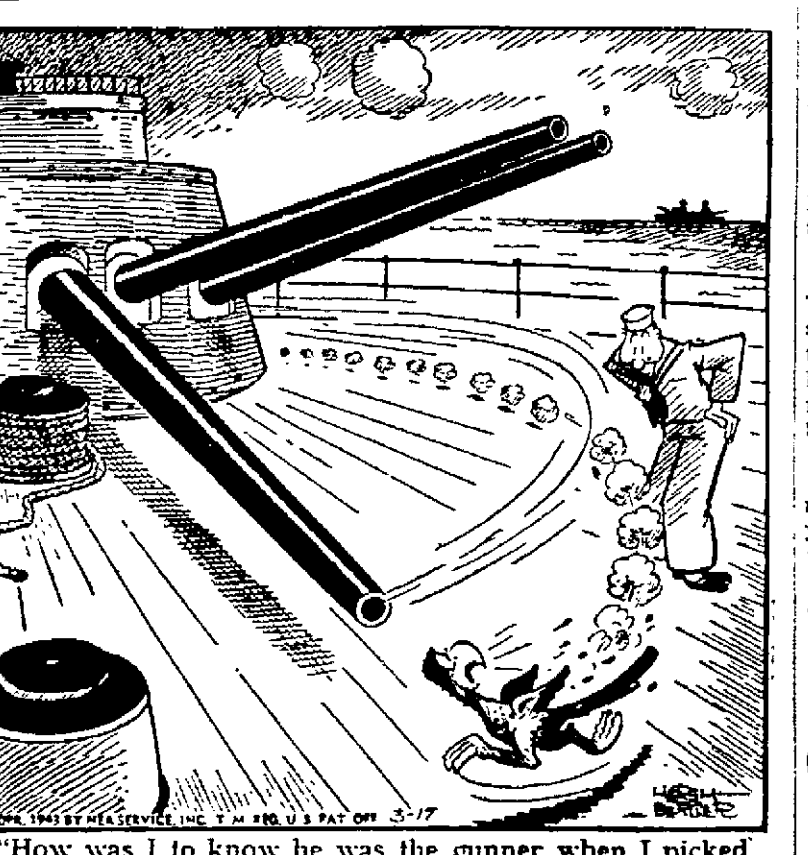

Laughs And Wartime Thrills Coming To State Thursday

"I Married A Witch" And "Army Surgeon" Are Co-Featured; "Air Force" Slated At Ohio Friday

Fredric March talks turkey to heroine Veronica Lake during the gay action of "I Married a Witch," the laugh-a-minute Rene Clair comedy due Thursday at the State. Racing against time, a young medical officer and an army nurse conquer death in a cave-in dugout in "Army Surgeon," also due Thursday at the State. Jane Wyatt, James Ellison and Kent Taylor are starred.

Made with the cooperation of the United States Air Corps, "Air Force," which comes to the Ohio on Friday, is said to be one of the most exciting dramas of heroism that the screen has yet given us. For plot, this picture, has the simplest, yet perhaps, the most dramatic story ever told; the daily log of a Boeing Flying Fortress as it makes its way across the troubled waters of the Pacific ocean. Now showing at the Ohio is "They Got Me Covered," a laugh riot with Bob Hope.

Lee Tracy, portraying a newspaper reporter, uncovers a murder and money theft in "The Payoff," currently flashing on the Sigma screen. What happens when a courageous young marshal sets about unmasking a gang of outlaws who pose as honest vigilantes in a remote Arizona town, forms the basis of the co-feature, "Pirates of the Prairie."

Henry Fonda has been a top ranking star for seven years, and Maureen O'Hara for three, yet the two romantic leads were never cast together until Hollywood filmed "Immortal Sergeant," currently at the Quilna. It deals with Remmel's rout on the burning sands of the Libyan desert.

The Lyric's current hit, "The Pied Piper," tells the enthralling story of an old Englishman who lead a band of helpless children across embattled France to England and safety. Taking the part of the Englishman is Monty Woolley. Also showing is "Sing Your Worries Away."

Woolley, the former professor of dramatics at Yale came to Hollywood for "Dinner" and decided to stay on, says the answer to that one is relative. Why, fan mail—that's how all the stars find out what their public thinks! And ever since his impersonation of the monstrous Sheridan Whitehead in "The Man Who Came to Dinner," Woolley's been receiving as much mail as the glamor crowd.

It might be appropriate at this time to mention that Monty Woolley does a complete about face in his latest picture, "The Pied Piper," at the Lyric theatre. He plays a lovable, albeit somewhat cantankerous, Englishman who

gets along famously with Ruddy McBowall, Anne Baxter and many other young people. Of all the moral Monty received, there is one he prides above all others: "I think you're one of the cutest men on the screen today. And dignified, too. I sincerely hope the nun I marry is as handsome as you are!"
