

Pacific Aerial Warfare Is Dramatized On Ohio Screen

John Garfield Cast As Gunner Aboard Flying Fortress; Gig Young And Harry Carey Also Featured

John Garfield is cast as a gunner in the crew of the Boeing Flying Fortress, "Mary Ann," in the drama of air warfare in the Pacific "Air Force," which comes to the Ohio theatre on Friday. Gig Young and Harry Carey also have two principal roles. Ending Thursday is "They Got Me Covered," a comedy with Bob Hope.

Commencing Friday night at the Quilna preview will be "Boston Blackie Goes Hollywood," in which fiction's slickest crook tangles with a dangerous gang of blackmailing jewel thieves. Chester Morris portrays "Blackie," "Lucky Legs," with Jinx Falkenburg and Kay Harris, also will show Friday night. "Immortal Sergeant," a war picture, shows Thursday afternoon.

A daring flier scatters enemy planes from the skies with his dazzling exploits but is unable to rout another man from the heart of the girl he loves in the current State hit, "Army Surgeon," which stars James Ellison, Jane Wyatt and Kent Taylor. Also showing is "I Married a Witch."

The efforts of a young deputy marshal to restore law and order in a desert town in Arizona is the plot of the Sigma attraction, "Pirates of the Prairie," Tim Holt and Nell O'Day have the lead roles. "The Payoff," dealing with the adventures of a newspaper reporter, also is on the Sigma screen.

A mystery-adventure drama, "Danger in the Pacific," with Leo Carrillo, Don Terry and Louise Allbritton, commences an engagement at the Lyric on Friday. Now showing at the Lyric are "The Pied Piper," and "Sing Your Worries Away."

Opening Thursday at the Majestic are "Fangs of the Wild," and "Ship Ahoy."

Gig Young currently enacting the role of co-pilot in "Air Force," first film to depict accurately the hardships faced by our air arm in South Pacific waters, is playing his part with a vengeance. "Air Force" opens Friday at the Ohio theatre.
Gig knows too well the tragic story of too little and too late. His father-in-law and close pal, Jim Beverly Stapler, is today a prisoner of war because of that dramatic condition among our far-flung outposts air fighters.
Stapler, formerly a wealthy gold mine operator of Baguio, Philippine Islands, was among the very first prisoners taken by the Japanese. Except for the newspaper account listing him among war prisoners, not a word has been heard from him, either by Gig or Gig's wife, the former Sheila Stapler.
"If 'Air Force' helps hammer home the necessity for more and bigger bombers in the South Pacific," Gig says, "then I will at least have helped to some degree in avenging Jimmie Stapler's plight. I don't know of a better way of bringing home the message than the stark, unadorned story of heroism shown by our airmen that 'Air Force' tells."
Young, who was discovered by his own studio thru his work in "The Gay Sisters" is rated high among Hollywood newcomers. In "Air Force" he shares billing with John Garfield, Harry Carey, George Tobias and Arthur Kennedy.

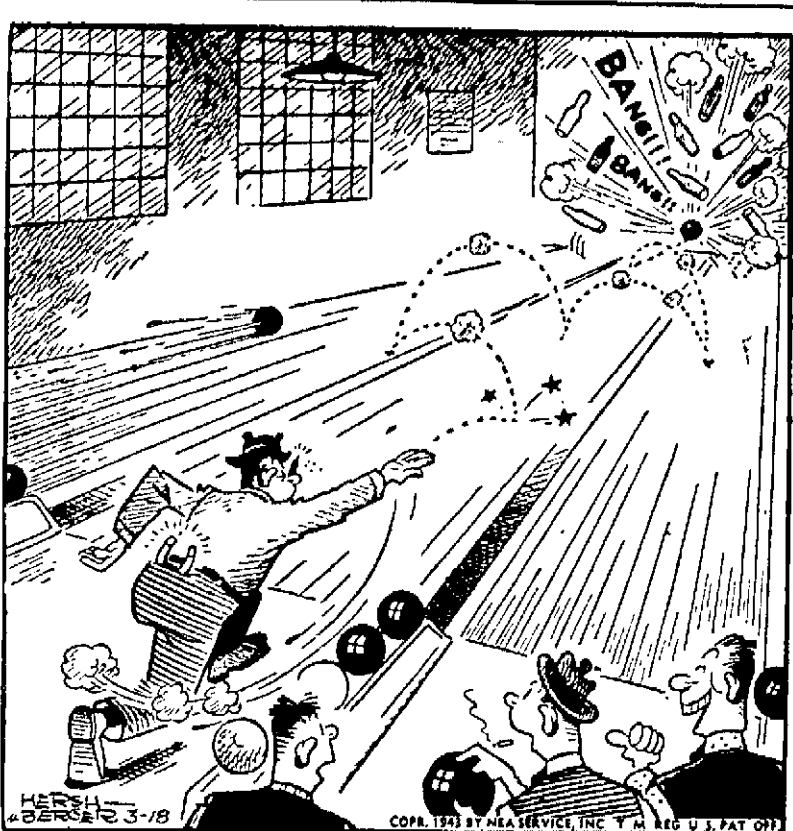

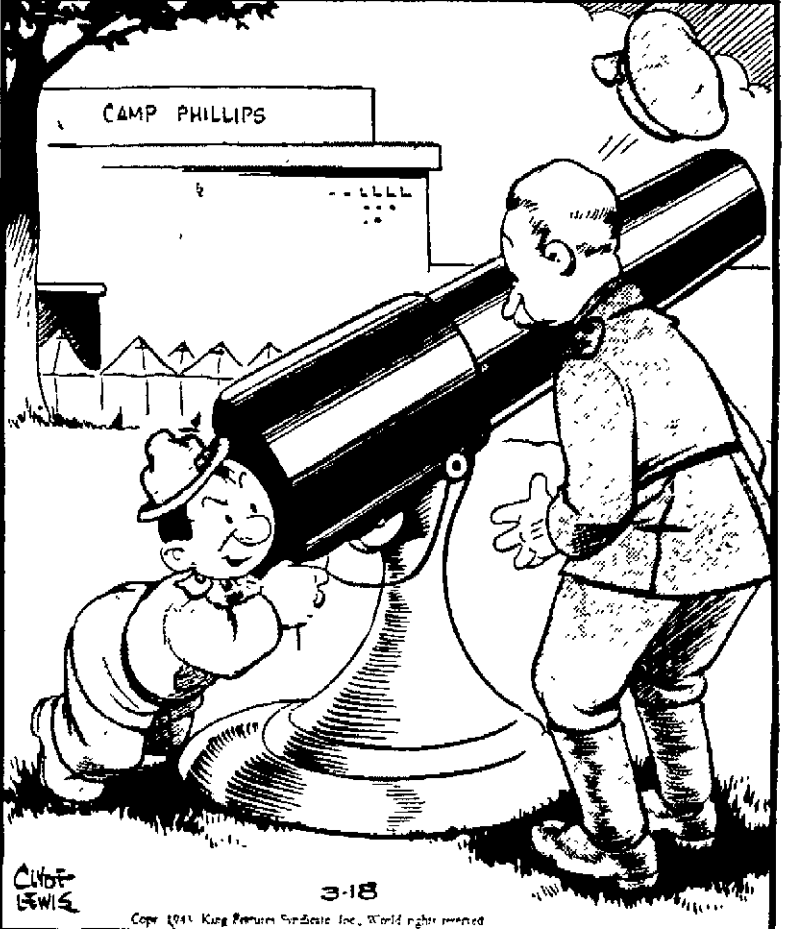
