Uncle Ray's Corner

"TRUE MASTODON" WAS RE-IDENTIFIED OF NORTH AMERICA

DURING the middle part of the Age of Mammals, there were beasts of many kinds. Some of them remind us of modern animals. Others were very different from anything we have today.

One mammal was horse-like but was only the size of a sheep. It had three toes on each foot, instead of the single toe, or hoof, on a horse's foot at the present time.

Another mammal was the one known as the "glyptodon." The name means "carved tube," and was given because of 20 grooved teeth in the mouth of each of the animals.

The glyptodon often reached a length of six or seven feet. The body was covered with a large bony shield, something like that of a turtle. The head and the tail also were covered with bony armor plate.

Many skeletons of glyptodons have been found in the pampa region of Argentina and other South American countries. The race died out long ago, but we now have somewhat similar animals, known as "armadillos."

A third mammal of that period is called by a name meaning "ancient mastodon." It was on the order of an elephant. The nose was stretched out into a trunk, but not such a long one as an elephant has. Its underjaw was very long. In place of certain teeth were short tusks, shorter than those

ground, perhaps to locate roots which were good to eat. Remains of the ancient mastodon have been found in west-central Egypt, in an area now classed as a desert. This animal was different from later mastodons.

The so-called "true mastodon" lived on our own continent. It was larger, and it had much longer tusks. It was about equal in size to a modern elephant.

Monkeys and apes also won a place in the Age of Mammals. They spent most of their time in trees, where they were fairly safe from the attacks of enemies.

Among the beasts which were a danger to smaller animals were tigers. These included the famous saber-tooth, which had two long, sharp teeth at the front of its upper jaw. Those teeth were as much as seven inches long.
