Newly Appointed Manpower Board To Hold First Meeting Here Soon

Plans to reduce job shopping and labor piracy in Lima, which are said to be cutting deeply into the production of war materials, will be considered within the next few days when the newly appointed Lima Area Manpower Committee will hold its first

This announcement was made Saturday By E. M. Seving, the committee's acting director of Sidney, who also said the overall employment situation in the Lima area will be reviewed. The committee, made up of four representatives of management and four leaders in organized labor, will study employment stabilization plans now in effect in other areas.

"There is an indication," Seving said, " that there will be a shortage of labor as we reach peak production in this area unless we fully utilize the local labor supply. We want to plan now to have the workers who will be




