

Moropus skeletons are not very common, but several dozen of them have been found and placed in museums. The earliest known skeleton of this animal was discovered in Wyoming, and belonged to an animal only about the size of a sheep. Excellent skeletons have come from western Nebraska, and they show a height of five or six feet at the shoulders.

Another odd beast of the past was a piglike animal sometimes called "the giant swine." This animal had a large head, but did not possess the long tusks which are weapons of present-day wild
