Hannibal Became Rome's Bitter Enemy During Boyhood

IN HISTORY we read about "the Punic wars." The name "Punic" came from the Latin language, and its meaning is "Carthaginian."

The Carthaginian, or Punic, wars were fought between Carthage and Rome. They lasted for 118 years. There were periods of peace between the three main wars, but there were 43 years of actual fighting.

Dropping into the midst of the Punic wars, we find Hannibal, one of the most skillful generals of history. He it was who led the armies of Carthage in the second Punic war.

The father of Hannibal also was a general and an enemy of Rome. Legend says that as an eight-year-old boy Hannibal was told to swear that he would treat Rome as an enemy all through his life. The order, 'twas said, came from his father.

Whether or not the legend is true, it is certain that Hannibal was told many things against Rome during his boyhood. Much of his time in that period was spent with soldiers, learning the ways of war. When he reached young manhood, he felt himself a soldier with the duty of making war on Rome.

The Romans, on their side, were bitter enemies of Carthage. They wanted to spread their power over Spain and over the part of Africa now called Tunisia. Carthage, which had been a center of sea power, stood in their way.

a tremendous demand for doctors in the army and navy.

In battles on land, the Romans usually came out victors. There was a question whether the soldiers of Carthage would dare to challenge Rome on the continent of Europe.

Would they fearfully stay in Carthage (in the midst of what we now call Tunisia) or would they strike across the sea? Would they wait perhaps, until Rome built up complete control of the sea?

Hannibal was the man who was to answer these questions. At the age of 25 he became the chief general of Carthage, following the death of his father. Hardly had he taken over power before he ordered the first steps of a drive on Rome. He struck through Spain, and marched with his soldiers in the direction of northern Italy.
