LEIPSIC MAN IS NAMED TO POST AS INSPECTOR

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, April 2—Appointment of Clarence Montooth of Leipsic to the post of sanitary inspector for Putnam county was announced here today by the county board of health.

This appointment is in preparation for the inspection of all establishments where food and drink are sold, it was explained by Dr. H. A. Neiswander, county health commissioner. He pointed out that in a short time the county health certificates must be renewed by operators and employees of these establishments.

Montooth's duties will consist of visiting each of these establishments in Putnam county and checking the sanitary conditions of the places. Unless the inspector approves the establishment, it will not be permitted to operate under the county health board ordinance governing these business places.

SIXTH CONVICT WOMEN CAN SEE HOW THEY IS DEAD FROM LOOK IN WAVE UNIFORM POISON POTION

(Lima News Bureau) BUCKHANNON, W. Va., April 2—(UP)—Fred Richard Hickman, 21, of Harrison-co. died early this morning, making a total of six convicts to succumb after an anti-freeze solution drinking party.

Physicians at St. Joseph's hospital said the four remaining men still were gravely ill, and little hope was held for their recovery.

Five of the convicts, all trustees at a Webster Springs road prison camp, died yesterday and Wednesday after the drinking orgy. State Road Commissioner Ernest L. Bailey said the ten men gained anti-freeze from radiators of state road equipment and smuggled it into their quarters.

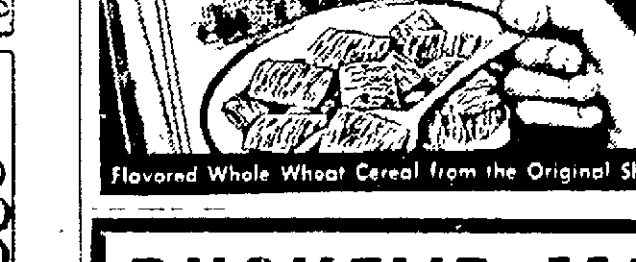

FINDS COUSIN ON OTHER END OF RESCUE ROPE

(Lima News Bureau) LONDON, April 2—(UP)—Francis Quinn, 23, wasn't so amazed at his experience aboard a torpedoed vessel but when he hauled himself aboard a rescue ship and found cousin Jim Quinn on the other end of the rope, the shock nearly smacked him back overboard.

"Surprised?" said Francis. "Why, I was so damned surprised I couldn't say a word." Francis Quinn, of Charlestown, Mass., was one of 24 young American navy gun crew members aboard a merchantman sunk recently in the North Atlantic.

They were rescued by a U. S. Coast Guard cutter and brought to a port in the British Isles.
