Life Of Andrew Johnson Comes To Ohio On Tuesday

Dramatic Historical Novel Opens Engagement As Sigma Schedules Story Of Australian Aborigines

The darkest period of American history, the strained days following the close of the Civil war, form the dramatic historical background for much of the tense action in "Tennessee Johnson," based on the life of Andrew Johnson, which opens an engagement at the Ohio Tuesday. Van Heflin portrays the President who followed Abraham Lincoln into office.

A stirring story of life along the Pacific waterfront, "Moon-tide," commences an engagement at the Lyric on Tuesday with Jean Gabin, the French star, in the lead role. John Payne, Maureen O'Hara, Randolph Scott, Nancy Kell, William Tracy and Maxie Rosenbloom have principal roles in "To the Shores of Tripoli."

Tuesday and Wednesday will be the final days for the showing of "Casablanca," at the State theatre. Starring Ingrid Bergman, Humphrey Bogart and Paul Henreid, it tells about the hazardous existence of refugees stranded in that North African city. Richard Dix, Wendy Barrie and Don Porter have three lead roles in the thriller, "Eyes of the Underworld" which completes the bill.
