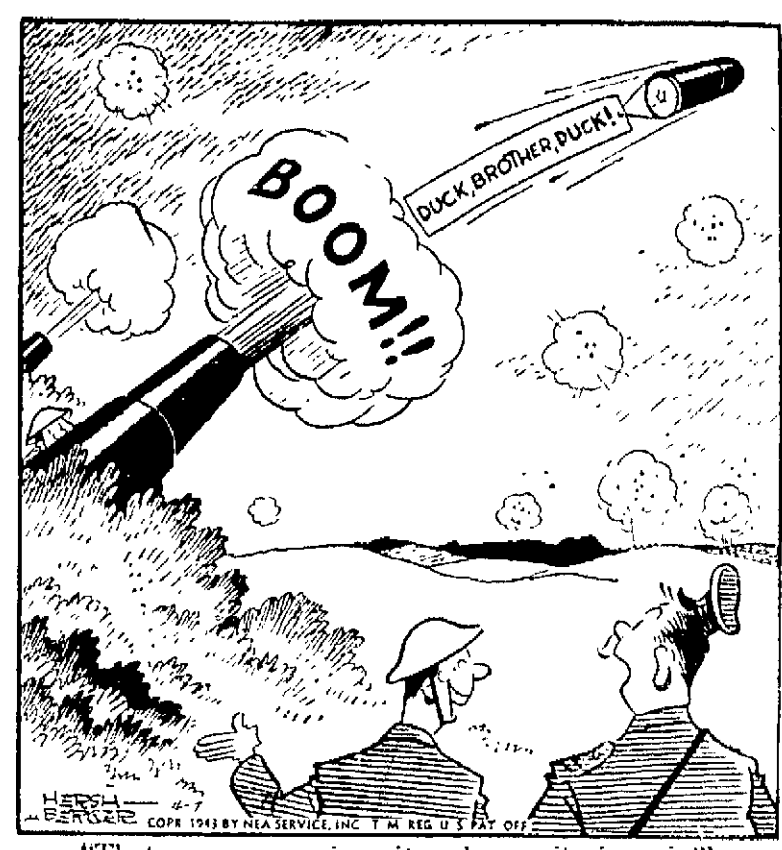

Book Reviews

GREENLAND. By Vilhjalmur Stefansson. Doubleday, Doran and Co. \$3.50.

If you should doubt the timeliness of a book on Greenland you might read the last two chapters of this book first. Having done that you will undoubtedly go back and read the entire book. The final chapters deal with the strategic importance of Greenland in the defense of the Western hemisphere, and Stefansson, our most distinguished authority on all Arctic matters, has laid the problem before us with skill, thoroughness and vitality.

He traces the history of Greenland from the early voyages, through the discovery of America, the establishment of the Christian church, and on down to the present.

FIFTY YEARS BELOW ZERO. By Charles D. Brower. Dodd, Mead and Co. \$3.90.

In 1883 Charles Brower, after several years of a sailor's life, made his first voyage to the Arctic in search of a fortune in whalebone for Northern Alaska, chiefly Port Barrow, most of the time since that first venture.

He is known thruout Alaska as "King of the Arctic" and is probably Uncle Sam's most northerly citizen, as well as one of his most unpretentious ones.

MRS. PARKINGTON. By Louis Bromfield. Harper and Brothers. \$2.75.

A portrait study of a New York grand dame, aged 84 in 1912, who came out of Leaping Rock, Nev., at the age of 17, married to Major Parkington, one of New York's early "robber barons." After his death Mrs. Parkington lived on head of her family, a keen manager of her immense fortune, an intimate of kings and queens, and a woman of charm to the end of her life.

EX - PRESIDENT OF FRANCE DIES

LONDON, April 7 -- (AP) - The Berlin radio, in a broadcast prepared by the Associated Press, reported Alexander Millerand, president of the French Republic, from 1920-1921, died today at Versailles, at the age of 81.
