LONDON — (U,P) — Royal Air
Force bombers struck Germany's strongly-defended industrial Ruhr valley for the second straight time Friday night, loosing most of their explosive and fire bombs on the inland port city of Duisburg in a 15-minute "thunderbolt" attack.
Coastal command planes earlier in the night joined the latest around—the-clock air offensive, which began in daylight Thursday, with torpedo attacks on German shipping off the Norwegian coast. A hit was scored on a large tanker which burst on a large tanker which burst into flames and a second smaller

vessel probably was hit.
British Lose Eight Bombers Eight of the four-motored Lancaster, Stirling, and Halifax bombers which made the 600-mile round trip to the Ruhr failed to return, but the British raiders set great fires raging in Duisburg and other parts of the valley. coastal command bombers were missing from the Norwegian at-

tacks. British fighters and fighterbombers carried the offensive forward Saturday with attacks on transport targets in northern France and Holland. Spitfires, typhoons, and Mustangs damaged four locomotives, three freight trains, 18 tugs and barges, one trawler, one dredge, and four oil tanks. Fighter-bomber pilots attacked a factory along a railway at Yvetot, France, between Dieppe and Le Havre.

Five planes were missing from those operations.

The air ministry said that in addition to Duisburg, a city of some 275,000 at the junction of the Ruhr and Rhine rivers, the RAF's "night hawk's bombed other objectives in the war-torn Ruhr where the strongest concentration of searchlights and anti-aircraft guns in Europe guard some of Germany's most valuable war plants.

One of those plants, the great Krupp munitions works in Essen, "appears to be almost entirely inactive" after the 900-ton bomb raid there the night of Apr. 3, the ministry disclosed Saturday night.

The raid on Duisburg was the 58th of the war and the first since the night of Mar. 26. The Friday night force, it was disclosed, was not so strong as that of Thursday night which, flying into severe gales which iced up the planes, battered targets in the Ruhr at a cost of 21 planes.

The German communique from the Berlin radio did not admit the attack on Duisburg, saying merely that western Germany was hit and that at several places there were civilian casualties and dam-
