

Most Stags Add Points to Horns Until They Reach Old Age

■HERE are about 50 kinds I of deer in the world, and the facts about their horns, or antlers, differ somewhat. In most cases the males have antlers which grow out each year but which are lost before the start of the following year.

The male, often called a "stag," has solid antlers. The horns of such animals as cattle and buffaloes are hollow. Usually, the antiers of a stag

keep adding new "tines" or "points" as the years go by. In the first year it has horns, the stag can boast of only one point points, the third year three points and so on.
