### Uncle Ray's Corner

Most Stags Add Points to Horns Until They Reach Old Age

THERE are about 50 kinds of deer in the world, and the facts about their horns, or antlers, differ somewhat. In most cases the males have antlers which grow out each year but which are lost before the start of the following year.

The male, often called a "stag," has solid antlers. The horns of such animals as cattle and buffaloes are hollow.

Usually, the antlers of a stag keep adding new "tines" or "points" as the years go by. In the first year it has horns, the stag can boast of only one point on each one, the second year two points, the third year three points and so on. In many cases the number of tines will increase to a dozen or more. When a stag becomes old, however, it may lose points with the passing years, instead of gaining them.

There are exceptions to the rule about the change in the number of points. The sambar and axis deer, for example, almost always start adding points after they grow their third pair of antlers.

The females, or does, have no horns or antlers—except among the reindeer and caribou. Reindeer and caribou females have antlers, but not such large ones as the males. Caribou are found in great numbers in some parts of Canada. They are relatives of the true reindeer which were brought into North America from Siberia.
