MACKINAW, III., April 15 ---(INS)-"Shoe Doctors" at Fort repair 2,000 pairs of shoes a day, offer a few tips to harried citizens who fear they will not be able to get by on three pair of "brogans"

Lieut. Ross W. Crossley, in charge of the shop under Col. Stephen B. Massey, chief of the post's Supply Division, asserted that miles and months of wear could be added to the life of just a plain pair of shoes if the "10 Commandments" adopted by the repair shop were followed. The Commandments are:

Do not use water to clean shoes; use a good brush and rag. | the same as last year, Lawrence 3. Use a dobbing solution where K. 4. Change shoes daily as perspiration keeps them damp and causes the leather to depreciate.

5. Never soak new shoes in water as it impairs quality and service of the leather. 6. Always keep an extra pair of

shoes free from dirt, grease and grime to increase the life of 7. Never stuff socks into shoes.

8. Never dry shoes near excessive heat as the heat tends to draw and crack the leather and weakens the stitching.

9. Expose wet shoes to cool. fresh air, and do not store shoes in closets, bags or lockers where air cannot get to them.
