Yank Jub Sink Five Jap Ships

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—American submarines have sunk five more Japanese ships and damaged two others in Pacific and Far Eastern waters the navy announced Saturday.

Ships sent to the bottom were a large supply ship, two medium sized cargo carriers, a large mine layer, and a small patrol vessel. A destroyer and a medium sized transport were damaged.

These sinkings raised to 148 the total of Japanese ships sent to the bottom since the outbreak of war.

Oil Line Trench Blasted Across River

MARIETTA, Pa. (U.P.)—Workmen laying a section of the 850-mile Illinois-to-East coast extension of the world's largest oil pipeline today blasted a 450-foot trench across the Susquehanna river with what a federal official described as the "biggest riverbed explosion in history."

Paul C. Woodbridge, federal petroleum administration for war, said explosive experts spent three weeks preparing for the blast which left a ditch 5 feet wide in the river. He estimated that 30 tons of explosives would be required to blast across the 2,000 foot wide river.

Uncle Ray's Corner

IN CENTRAL Indiana, not far east of Indianapolis, is the village of Greenfield. The last time Greenfield's people were counted, there were 4,821 of them.

Greenfield is not a very large place, but it has been a village for a long time. Away back in 1849, it became the birthplace of an infant who was to become famous.

The infant was James Whitcomb Riley, and he was to be called "the poet of the common people."

During his boyhood, Riley found many ways of enjoying himself. Not the least of these was in swimming, and he was to tell about this sport in a poem called "The Old Swimmin' Hole."

As a young man, Riley spent his time wandering up and down the valley of the Ohio river, with several other young men, he painted signs for merchants. At a later time, he told about this work in the following words:

"We called our business
