The Jersey cabbage commonly has a stem from six to nine feet high, but nine feet is not the record. Jersey has produced cabbage plants with stems which measure from 12 to 16 feet! The stems are made into canes to sell to tourists. Jersey folk use the stems as rafters for small thatched buildings.
