Lana Turner And Walter Brennan Bring New Delight To Screwball Comedy Fans At Ohio Theatre

LAUGHS COME IN SWIFT ORDER IN FILM PLAYING AT THE OHIO

Comicality piles on comicality as Lana Turner and Robert Young romp thru a series of adventures in high gear in "Slightly Dangerous," the romantic comedy now playing at the Ohio Theatre.

Lana plays the sad clerk in a department store, of which Young is the new manager. Tired of her routine, she puts on an exhibition of mixing sodas blindfolded, Young "fires" her. She leaves a suicide note, poses as an amnesia victim and is "discovered" as a millionaire's long lost daughter.

Blamed for the "suicide," Young hunts for her to save his job. He finds her and then proceeds to expose her. But it is not until a series of laugh-provoking episodes are unfolded that they discover they are really in love.

The adventure comes to an end in a delightful manner, cleverly worked out and also effectively handled by all of the principals.

Miss Turner wears some elaborate frocks. She also displays a fine flair for light comedy. Walter Brennan is at his best as the "sugar daddy." Others in the supporting cast who contribute ably to laughs include Eugene Pallette, Alan Mowbray, Howard Freeman, Dame May Whitty, Millard Mitchell, Ward Bond, Pamela Blake, Ray Collins and Florence Bates.
