GERMAN RADIO HINTS OF NEW U-BOAT TACTICS

(By The United Press) Germany's threatened "new tactic" in U-boat warfare appeared today to be a cover-up for failures to score big successes in April and May. A Transocean (German) News Agency communique broadcast by Radio Berlin said that a "pause which has now come to an end has given an opportunity for new formation and regrouping of German submarines. The dispatch said that March sinkings—admitted by the Allies to be high—could be credited to the use of sub flotillas or "wolf packs." Giving the regrouping "pause" as an apparent excuse for failure to maintain the March sinkings, the broadcast added: "... The statement indicated another novelty as regards the employment of the German submarine fleet. Whether the present regrouping foreshadows a new tactic remains naturally open to question."

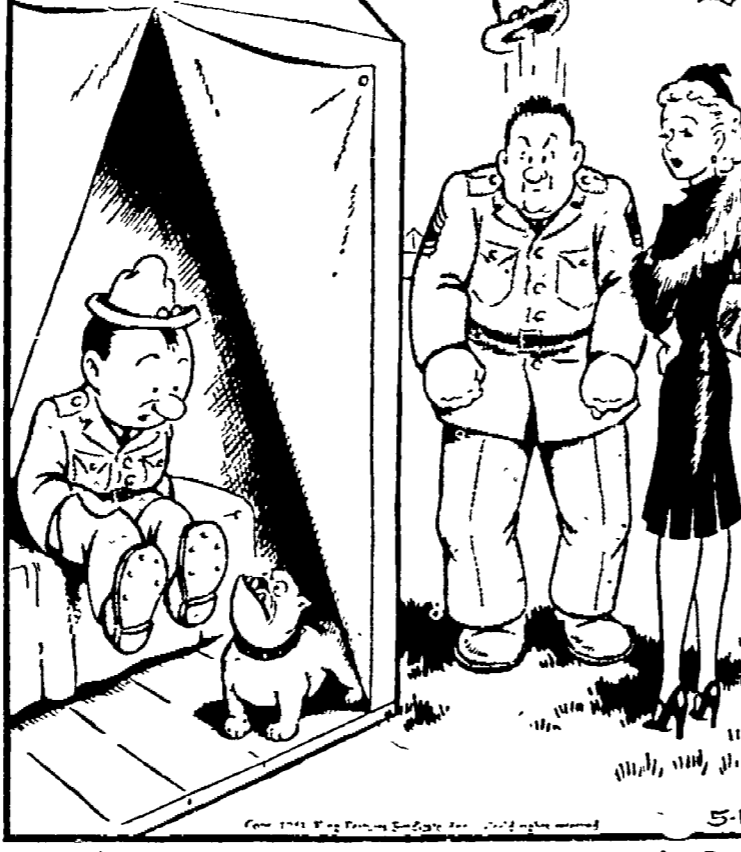

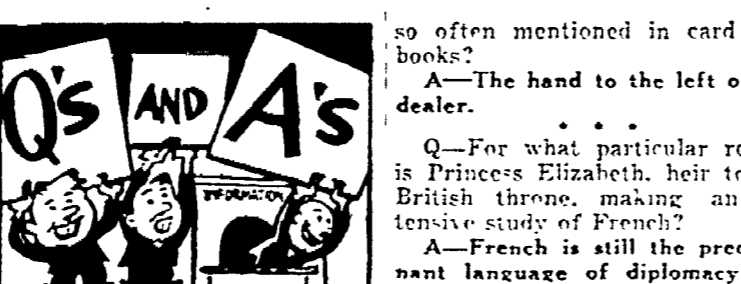

Actor Otto Krueger has his usual suave veneer kicked out from under him in the thrill film of the China war front, "Night Plane From Chungking," currently at the Sigma. Robert Preston and Ellen Drew are the stars. Completing the program is "Sherlock Holmes in Washington," a timely film with Basil Rathbone and Marjorie Lord.

QUILNA A glittering panorama of song, music and fun is presented currently at the Quilna theatre in "The Hit Parade of 1943." With Susan Hayward and John Carroll heading the cast, the story moves at a rapid and gay pace from one engaging situation to another, leaving a highly satisfying reaction with yesterday's preview audience.

WATERWORKS TO REOPEN WELL

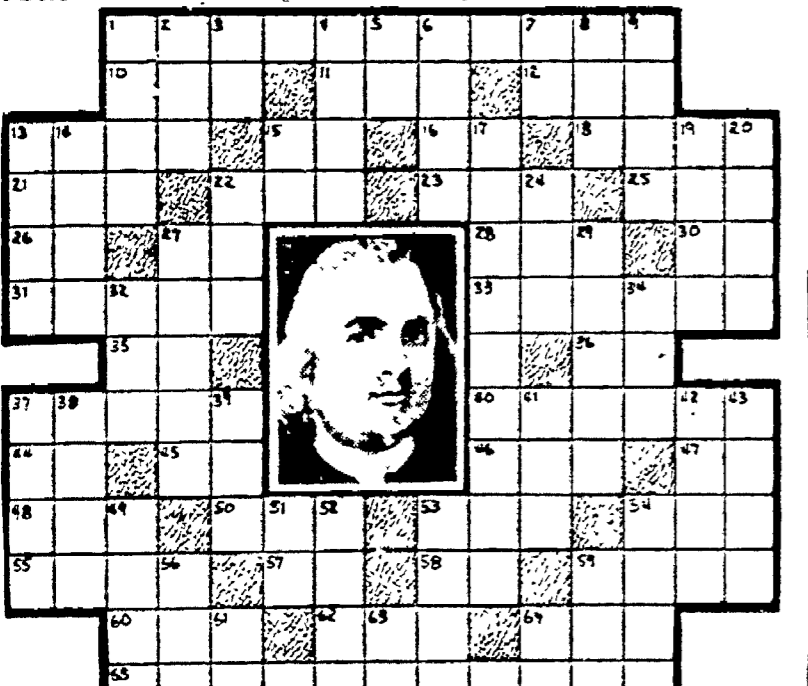
(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, May 10—A well which has been out of use for 14 years is to be reopened in a short time by the Ottawa municipal waterworks, it was learned today by John Gerding, superintendent. The Ottawa council has granted the superintendent authority to make expenditures necessary for this move. Gerding said that recent water usage in Ottawa has depleted the supply in three wells now in use faster than they have been replenished due to the lateness of spring rains. The well which will be put back into use was closed in 1929, he stated. It has a pumping capacity of 35 gallons per minute and will enable the waterworks to maintain its normal reserve of water while supplying all the needs of the community. Performances will be given at 3 and 8 p. m. with the gates opening one hour earlier.
