

New Romantic Comedy Coming To Quilna Wednesday Night

Jean Arthur, Joel McCrea And Charles Coburn Starred In Story Of Crowded Washington

Silhouetted against the exciting background of jam-packed Washington, Hollywood's new romantic comedy, "The More the Merrier," is scheduled to make its local bow Wednesday night at the Quilna preview. Principal roles are taken by Jean Arthur, Joel McCrea and Charles Coburn.

Patriotism triumphs over love in "Flight for Freedom," coming Friday to the Ohio, a powerful action story of naval intelligence starring Rosalind Russell and Fred MacMurray. The third man in the triangle is Herbert Marshall, who heads a supporting cast of 40 capable players. "Happy Go Lucky," ends Thursday.

Romance and fear are deftly combined in "Cat People," State's new offering which brings a terrifying Balkan legend up to date against a modern New York City background. Simone Simon, Kent Smith and Jane Randolph have the lead roles. Marjorie Woodworth is the heroine of "The McGueens From Brooklyn," which also shows.

The Sigma attraction is "A Stranger in Town," starring Frank Morgan, which has laughs, thrills and heart-throbs. It tells how Morgan, who is cast as a judge, helps cupid. Thrills galore are found in the second hit, "Bandit Ranger," which features fighting Tim Holt and Cliff Edwards. Joan Woodbury, as the daughter of a prison guard, falls in love with Edward Norris, a rebellious "son" in "Prison Mutiny," the lyric production. A thrilling chapter in the secret history of naval intelligence is the unusual basis of "Flight for Freedom," due Friday at the Ohio, newest co-starring vehicle for Rosalind Russell and Fred MacMurray.

Actually, she is to land at a remote island where a Navy vessel will pick her up — after Navy planes have scoured the area searching for her, and incidentally photographing Jap bases and airfields. But as she is about to take off from New Guinea for this particular leg of the trip she finds out the Japs know of the whole plan. It is too late to alter arrangements, and the girl knows how important it is for this country to have its information in case of war with Japan. There is but one thing for her to do, and she does it bravely and cheerfully, for a gripping climax to an unusual picture.

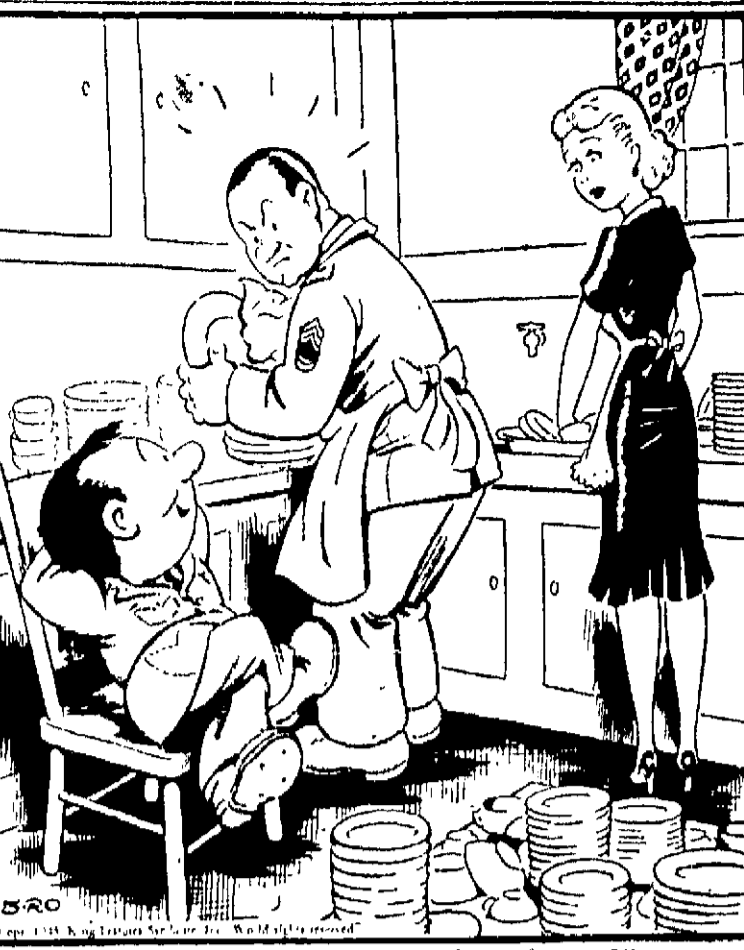
