








ing. Some of their boats have

large sails and long, narrow hulls.

Very possibly some white sailor from a wrecked vessel did reach the Gilberts long ago, but we have no record of it except in the leg-end. So far as history tells, a captain of the British navy first observed the islands in 1776. It seems that he did not stop to go ashore, but caused a note to be made in his log book.
