Delay in Planting Not As Bad As It Seems

Borer Peril

COLUMBUS, O., May 22-The determination of plants to bear seed is going to be a very important factor this year, as Ohio farmers count the days when no work can be done in the fields. Planting but Ohio State university agronomists declare the delay is not necessarily as bad as it appears.

Corn is the foundation of Ohio's farm industry, and a few days delay in corn planting may even prove to be beneficial. The European corn borer does considerthan it does in fields planted a little later than the normal Ohio planting date. The borer caused considerable damage in 1942.

Cool, wet weather has permitted Ohio wheat to repair some damage done by cold and heaving, and the past weeks have enabled clover and alfalfa to make some recovery from winter injuries. A hot spring day would have intensified the winter damage on wheat and legumes, so some credit will have to be given to the many spring days when no farm work could be

All possible amounts of feed supplies will be needed next winter, so Ohio farmers should not allow delays to prevent planting corn or soybeans. This is the year to place faith in the boast, "Ohio harvests never fail."

CULL LIVESTOCK WASTES FEEDS, EXPERT CLAIMS

COLUMBUS, O., May 22—Feed supplies are going to be none too plentiful in the 1943-44 feeding season, so it is important for Ohio farmers to make sure that grain and forage is used in the most effective ways. Guy W. Miller, farm management specialist, Ohio State university, says feeding records from Northeastern Ohio farms last winter show there may be great variations in the amount of milk, meat, or eggs produced by \$1 worth of livestock feed.

better than average job of making their farm enterprises profitable. The difference in their ability to obtain profits from livestock were due mostly to variations in the productive ability of the animals and poultry.

No farmer can make a hen lay more eggs or a cow give more milk than its inherited characteristics permit. Animals and domestic poultry have definite productive abilities beyond which they cannot be forced. Only the best farmers are able to get peak production from their poultry and livestock.

Miller says the lesson to be learned from these Ohio farm records is to cull out inferior livestock and poultry when feed supplies are limited. It will be very shortsighted to feed grain or hay to dairy cows in 1944 if those cows can produce only 50 or 75 per cent of the amount of milk which could be obtained from the same feed consumed by high producing cows.
