Perhaps for the first time on the screen the producers have dared bring the truth home by laying the background in a school.

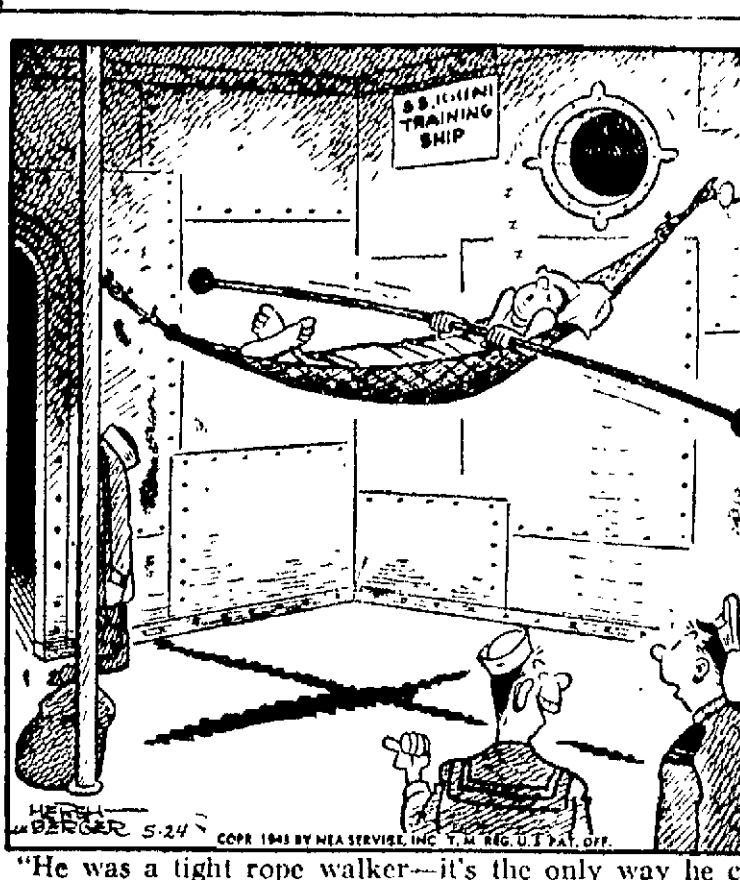

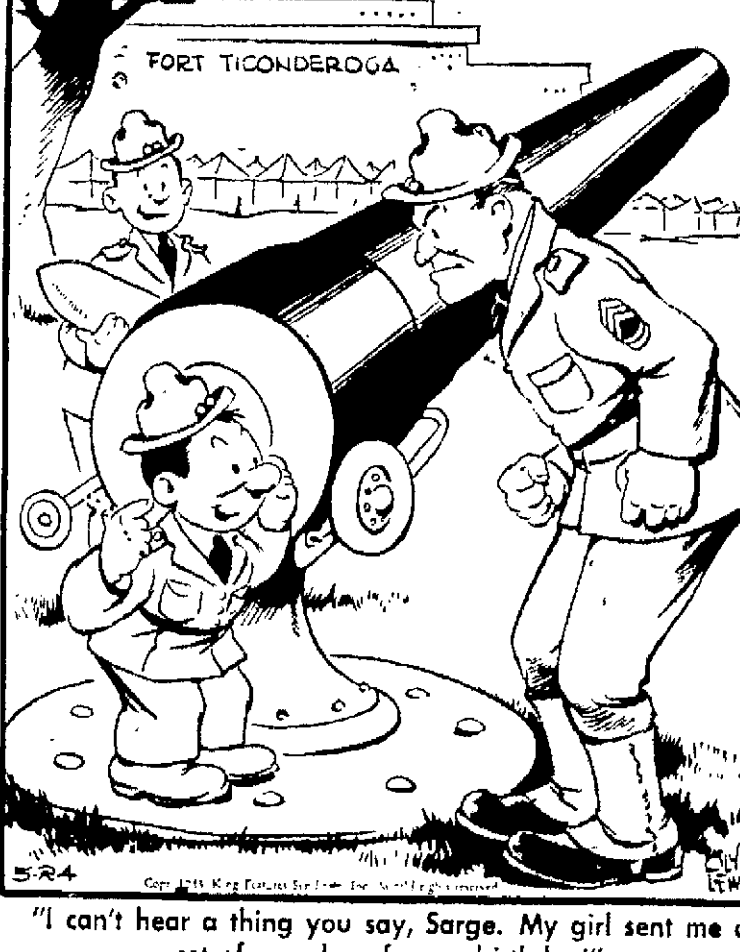

Book Reviews Books Reviewed Here May Be Obtained At The Lima Public Library, Main Library

BY MARY L. ECKFORD (Lima Library Staff Member) PACIFIC CHARTER, By Hallett Ahend. Doubleday, Doran and Co. \$2.50.

This is a hard hitting realistic evaluation of our stake in the Pacific area. Mr. Ahend believes that the crisis in Europe and the close ties between Great Britain and the United States have tended to deparage the importance of the Pacific area. He believes also that only the most drastic measures will allow peace to be maintained in the Pacific.

He gives an intimate and revealing picture of the palace politics that surround Hirohito, a revealing description of Matsukata Ahend served the New York Times as Far Eastern correspondent for 15 years so he is thoroughly equipped to present the eastern situation from the long view.

TILDA, By Mark Van Doren, Henry Holt and Co. \$2.00. Tilda Wentt lived in the city, kept house for her father and two younger brothers, worked in an office and somehow found time to do duty as an air raid warden. She is young, energetic, alive, and utterly unprepared for the disturbing nature of the thing that happens to her.

Her story moves thru the events of one week to an unforgettable ending. It is love story, pure and simple, but clear and satisfying as only a post like Mark Van Doren could write it.

SEVEN CAME THRU, By Edward Rickenbacker, Doubleday, Doran and Co. \$1.50. Besides the account of the rescue at sea, Rickenbacker tells in the book of the special mission that was the purpose of the fateful flight and of the conclusions he gained from it as to the future of American aviation.

The last thing Rickenbacker pretends to be is a hero or superman and his forthrightness and sincerity are implicit on every page. You feel that he is a strong man, strong in disaster, and a fighter for what he believes to matter how much others may disagree with him.

THE SEA IS SO WIDE, BY Evelyn Eaton, Harper and Brothers, \$2.50. Evelyn Eaton has made an incredibly moving and dramatic record from one of the most fascinating pages of colonial history the deportation of the whole Virginia colony to Nova Scotia because the British governor be-

lied the Acadians to be working on the side of the French. The Comenau family, thru whom the story is told, was peacefully in the little hamlet when the disaster fell. Young Barbe was in love with the English aid-camp, and she felt she had been betrayed when she was crammed into the prison hold of the transport. A vivid and unforgettable picture of a little known episode in history.

ELFVEN CAME BACK, Mabel Seelye, Doubleday, Doran and Co. \$2.00. Mabel Seelye is top-notch among mystery story writers. This time she proves her ability beyond any doubt. Her locale is a ranch near the Grand Tetons of Wyoming, which makes a superb background. "This is a story of real people dominated by familiar human passions and the violent events in which they become involved appear natural and inevitable," says one reviewer.
