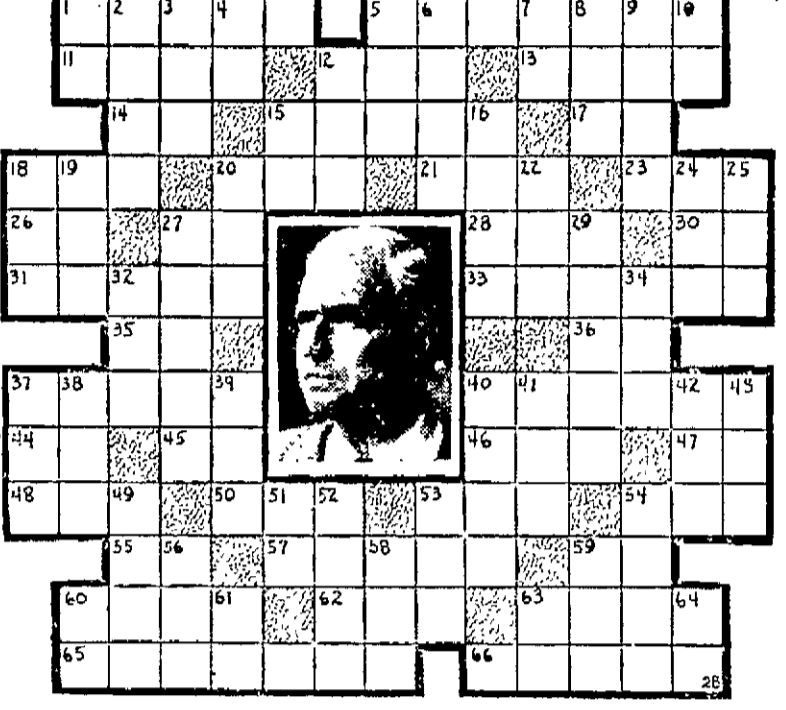

COLUMBUS, O., May 28—(AP)—The Ohio Pardon and Parole Commission has authorized the release on parole of George Fancher of Richland-co, serving a five to 20-year sentence for kidnaping, but denied freedom to Earl S. Montgomery, sentenced as Fancher's accomplice.

Fancher and Montgomery were sent to Ohio penitentiary for kidnaping Harold Stauffer at Mansfield on Nov. 18, 1939. They were accused of forcing Stauffer at gunpoint to drive his automobile into the country, where they robbed him of \$1 and took his car.

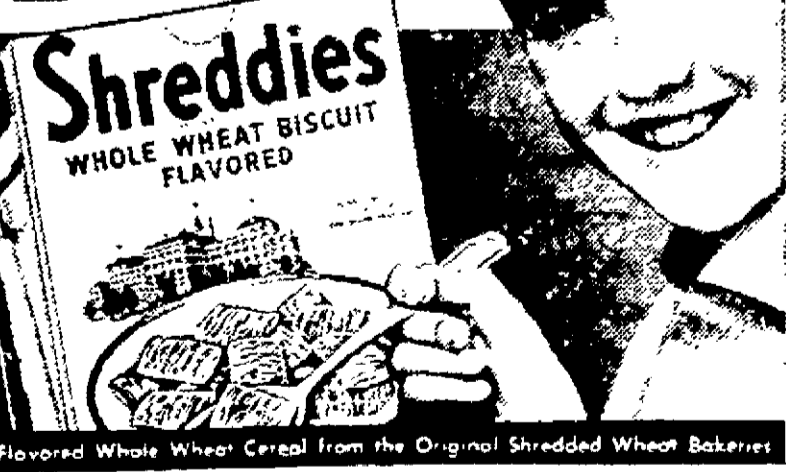

11 INDICTMENTS ARE LISTED BY GRAND JURORS

Findings Secret In Four Cases; Two Others Are Continued

Seven men indicted in true bills returned by the Allen-co grand jury in a three day session which closed late Thursday, will be arraigned before Common Pleas Judge Neal L. Lora on Wednesday at 10 a. m., the court announced Friday.

During the session which officials originally believed would last only two days, some 40 witnesses covering 13 cases were examined by the jury panel. A total of 11 true bills were returned, four of them secret, and two cases were continued, those of Joe Page and Jack Martin.

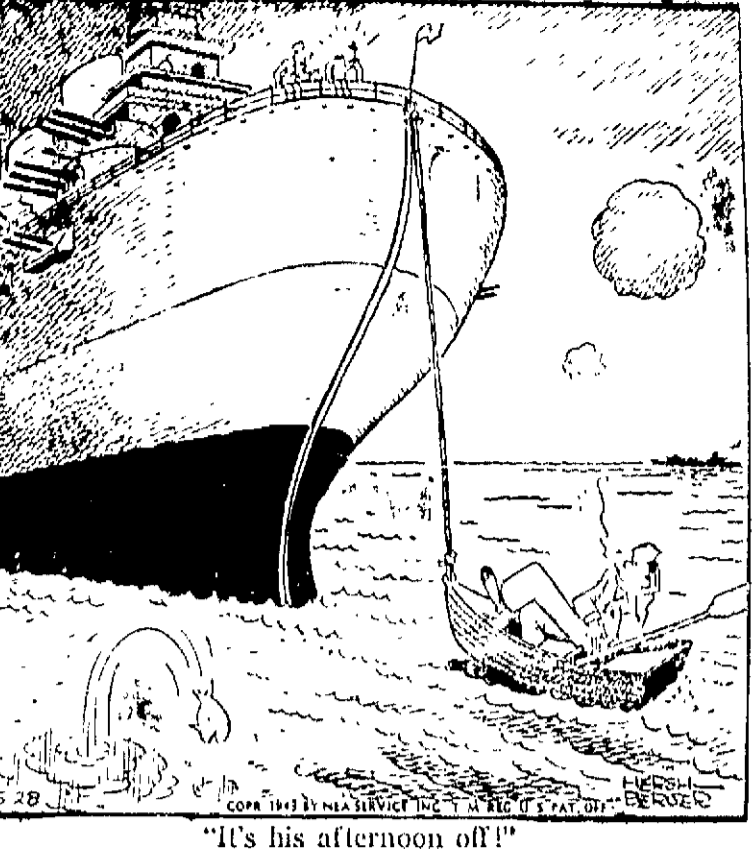
The jury in its inspection of the jail, demanded that exterior of the sheriff's residence be renovated and redecoreated and painted. It also recommended that the boys' ward be renovated and put in suitable condition; that girls and women be segregated and better quarters be arranged for them, and that provision be made for proper, suitable and segregated quarters for mental patients.
