

City Broadcasts to Feature Gene Autry, Commencement

Broadcasts of University of Wisconsin commencement features and presentation of a silver service to the navy, plus guest appearances of Sgt. Gene Autry and Nelson Olmsted, famed story-teller, will feature Madison stations' broadcasts tonight and Saturday.

Autry, Olmsted, and Third Officer Mary C. Kethley of the Women's Army Auxiliary corps, will appear with Pvt. Tweet, the Traux Field dance band, and others on Truax Field Calling over WIBA at 8:30 tonight.
