Also opening will be "Frankenstein and the Wolf Man," with Lon Chaney, Jr. and Bela Lugosi, ending Wednesday will be "Tarzan Triumphs" and "It Ain't Hay."

"Night for Crime," a suspenseful murder film with Glenda Farrell and Lyle Talbot, will open Thursday at the Lyric theatre along with "Lone Prairie." BREAK IN GAS LINE FAILS TO AFFECT SUPPLY

TOLEDO, O., June 2 — (INS)—Gas supplies were not threatened today in spite of the explosion in the Maumee, O., area of a section of the Panhandle Eastern gas line, thru which natural gas flows from Texas to Detroit.

The only damage caused by the explosion was to the gas regulator, which was blown off by the heavy pressure. For more than an hour gas spewed 300 to 500 feet in the air.

The line, owned by the Panhandle Eastern Pipeline Co., furnishes a portion of the gas used by the Ohio Fuel Gas Co., I. A. Ludwick, district manager of the gas company, reported. The section was recently completed and only about three weeks ago gas was taken into the gas firm's transmission system, he said.
