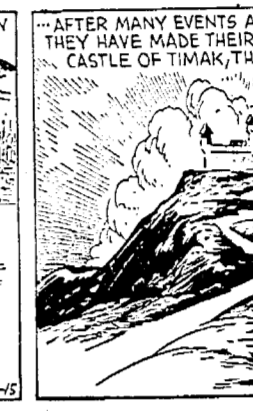

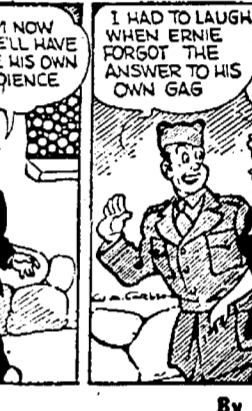

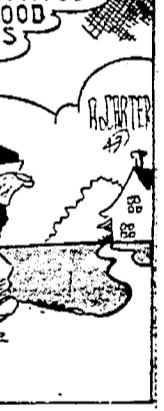

THE MOST popular of the world's "table drinks" is tea. More pounds of coffee are grown and sold each year, but a pound of tea makes many more cups than a pound of coffee. There are more people who drink tea than coffee.

Most tea-drinkers live on other continents. In North America a great deal more coffee is used than tea.

Tea is the national drink of China, and has been for centuries. China has more people than North and South America together!

In addition we find tea a common drink in India, Australia, the Union of South Africa and elsewhere. In Great Britain and Ireland it is even more popular than in China.

Because of its huge population, China uses more pounds of tea than any other country — not "more pounds per person," but more pounds for the whole nation.

China was the first nation to start the tea-drinking custom. Tea has been on Chinese tables for at least 1,800 years. There are records of tea being grown in China much longer ago than 1,300 years, but at first it was used as a medicine rather than as a table drink.

One legend says that a Buddhist hermit was the first person in China to drink tea. He decided to stay awake for nine years and to spend all of that time thinking about the beautiful life of the
