

Dramatic Story Of Bataan To Be Told On Ohio Screen

Grim Battle Of 13 Heroic Soldiers Against Japanese Hordes In Philippines To Be Shown Friday

Thirteen heroic soldiers, facing hordes of Japanese invaders, battle grimly to stave off the oncoming enemy in a dramatic episode in the defense of the Philippines in "Bataan," scheduled to open Friday at the Ohio. Told with stark realism, the picture features Robert Taylor, Thomas Mitchell, George Murphy and other favorites. Showing thru Thursday will be "Forever and a Day."

The new technicolor action drama starting Thursday at the Quilna, "Crash Dive," has many authentic shots of submarines in action. The film, which stars Tyrone Power, was made largely at the U. S. Naval base at New London, Conn. Anne Baxter also has a big role.

Coming to the Lyric Friday will be "Carson City Cyclone," thrills-packed yarn with Lynn Merrick and Don "Red" Barry. Also opening will be "Borrowed Hero." Ending Thursday will be "Commandos Strike at Dawn" and "Dr. Renault's Secret."

Commencing Thursday at the Majestic will be "Bambi," a Walt Disney feature, and "Joan of the Ozarks," a first class production. The Drive-in theatre will offer "My Favorite Spy" with Kay Kyser and his band and Adolphe Menjou on Friday. "Berlin Correspondent," shows thru Thursday.

Returning to Lima Thursday to show at the State will be "Tennessee Johnson," a story about the man who became president of the United States upon the death of Abraham Lincoln. It tells about the hardships he had during his youth and how he became the president. Van Heflin plays the role of the executive leader and others in the cast are Ruth Hussey as his wife and Lionel Barrymore as his political foe. Also showing will be "It Comes Up Love," with Gloria Jean.

Now showing at the Sigma is "Corregidor," adventure packed production starring Otto Kruger, Elissa Landi and Donald Woods. Completing the bill is "Sagebrush Law," filled with action and romance and starring rough and likeable Tim Holt.

"Bataan," vivid drama of a gallant group of Americans, waging a last-stand battle against Japanese hordes in the Philippines, brings Robert Taylor to the screen in what is probably the most dramatic role of his entire career. He plays a "hardboiled" sergeant, one of a group of thirteen "expatriates" who battle the Japs in a delaying action in the jungles. The picture comes Friday to the Ohio theatre.

Directed by Tay Garnett, the gripping drama of the heroism of outnumbered soldiers has a cast that includes George Murphy, Thomas Mitchell, Lloyd Nolan, Lee Bowman, Robert Walker, Barry Nelson, Philip Terry, Desti Arnaz, Tom Dugan, Kenneth Spencer, Roque Espiritu, Alex. Haver and Donald Curtis.

A thrilling story of an English house and seven generations of its owners is presented in "Forever and a Day," an Anglo-American production at the Ohio. A cast of more than 78 stars and featured players portrays the social and industrial progress of the country from 1804 until the present day.

There is a very catchy little ditty used as a theme number for "Commandos Strike at Dawn," which stars Paul Muni at the Lyric theatre, and behind the number is quite a tale.

Lester Cowan, who produced the picture for Columbia up in western Canada, heard a Norwegian folk song at a party there. It had no lyrics so he long-distanced his wife, Ann Ronnell, in New York, had the orchestra of the Empress hotel in Victoria play the piece to her and then play it a second time.

HERBERT RULES 7-DAY WEEK IS O. K. FOR WOMEN

COLUMBUS, June 17—(UP)—War plants whose production schedules require women employees to work more than 10 hours a day may also work women seven days a week, according to a ruling of Attorney General Thomas J. Herbert.

State Industrial Relations Director George A. Strain, charged with enforcement of female labor laws revised by the 85th assembly, asked Herbert for a formal opinion whether exceptions to the 10-hour day and 50-hour week allowed in the bill would also apply to the basic six-day week.

Herbert replied in an opinion yesterday that "if the war effort might be hindered or obstructed by limiting the hours of employment in any one day or week, it certainly would seem to follow that a limitation placed upon the days of employment in any week might have the same effect."
