

Kate Smith To Broadcast From Oldest U. S. Warship

Bill Stern To Interview Hugh Herbert, Top Screen Comedian, On Friday; Wilbur Enters Glutton's Contest

The deck of the oldest U. S. fighting ship afloat, the 146-year-old Constellation, will serve as a studio for the Kate Smith Speaks broadcast over WABC Friday at 12 noon. (EWT). The U. S. S. Constellation is docked at the Naval Training station at Newport, R. I., and serves as the flagship for Vice Admiral Ingersoll, Commander-in-Chief of the Atlantic fleet. Launched in 1797 as a 36-gun frigate, the veteran warship served its time in helping establish the young American republic.

Hugh Herbert, droll motion picture comedian, will be the guest of Bill Stern on his "Sports Newsreel" Friday (WEAF, 10:30 p. m. EWT). The man who makes millions laugh will be questioned by Stern as to his favorite sports. Hugh will tell how he went to Hollywood as a writer and instead helped make a success of other writers.

372 PUTNAM - CO YOUTHS SIGN FOR 4-H CLUB WORK

OTTAWA, June 18—There are 372 boys and girls enrolled in 4-H club work in Putnam-co for the 1943-44 period, it was reported here today by County Agent L. C. Holtkamp.

Of the total number of club members enrolled, 140 are boys and 232 are girls. The boys have set up 150 projects and the girls have started 327 projects for a total of 477. The youths have pledged 100 per cent completion of these projects as their contribution to the nation's war effort.

There are 23 clubs in the county with leaders urging each boy and girl to complete their projects to the best of their ability because of the need for increased production and the conservation of vital products.

Literature has been sent to all from some disgruntled tenants in the club leaders regarding the national contests on rural electrification and home ground beautification. Any 4-H club member may enter these contests, the agent explained.

The county 4-H leaders are conducting a tour of the various clubs during June to assist in any way possible in launching the youths' projects, Holtkamp reported.

M'GREGOR WILL OPPOSE MIDWEST GASOLINE SLASH

WASHINGTON, June 18—(AP)—Rep. J. Harry McGregor (R-Ohio), commenting on reports that gasoline rationing restrictions might be extended from the Atlantic seaboard states to Ohio, told the house:

"I am not going to agree to any program which will subject my people to additional hardship, additional inconvenience in order to make eastern motorists feel better."

McGregor, 17th district congressman, said Ohio would protest extension of the ban "if the facts show that we of the midwest are going to be penalized because a few eastern states can not get all the gasoline they want a situation dependent a great deal upon transportation and not upon a lack of gasoline."
