Father's Day **Books Abound** at City Library

At this time of the year, when dad is foremost in our minds, books in which father is the main character or subject may be found on the shelves of the Madison Free library. Reading about dads, both fiction and real, from the library collection can furnish humorous and serious hours of relaxation.

It is interesting to note that among the most popular books of recent years, several have been non-fiction and written by sons as a tribute to and a revelation of the life of their dads. Clarence Day's "Life with Father," a group of humorous essays, followed latter by the play version, has made Day's father an American classic. This is a book which any member of any family will chuckle over.

Pence More Serious Another book, in a similar but perhaps more serious vein, is Hartzell Spence's "One Foot in Heaven," the story of a practical parson. The lawyer is another important man in a small town. In "Country Lawyer," Bellamy Partridge writes of the 50 years of his dad's life as a guide to his neighbors through the mazes of the law, adjusting their difficulties, and arranging their affairs.

From a glance at the classics portraying fathers, father is not such a humorous character. Among these are "Fathers and Sons," by Turgenev; "Pere Gorict," by Honore de Balzac; "The Father," by Bjornstzerne Bjornson; "The Father," by August Strind Father," by August Strindberg, and "A Father," by Anton Chekov. All of these books are tragedies. The current trend of writing about fathers is more flippant.

· Several Anthologies all-year occasions featuring father as well as this specially designated Father's Day can also be found at the Madison Free library. "To My Dad," by Wallace and Frances Rice, and "Father," by Margery Doud and Cleo Parsons are two excellent anthologies of poetry. "Celebrations for Special Occasions," by Robert Haven Schauffler, and "Father in Modern Story" by Maud Van Buren will also be of help to program chairmen.

Of course there are many books addressed to Dad himself telling him how to be a real dad. Among these are "Growing Up with Our Children," by W. H. Burger; "Dad, Whose Boy Is Yours?," by Frank Cheley, and "Reverie of a Father," by John Crawley. Last, but not least, the prospective father, who will be celebrated on Dad's Day next year, is not forgotten. In Hazel Corbin's "Getting Ready to Be a Father," the prospective father will find a practical approach to maternity care from the father's point of view.
