

## HUGE DIAMOND ON WAY TO U.S.

RIO DE JANEIRO, June 21 -(INS)-The third largest diamond ever found in Brazil, known as the "Victory Diamond" and valued at \$200,000. today was shipped to the United States, consigned to Harry Winston of New, York City.

The stone, which weighs 328 50 carats, was wrapped in a small; package which weighed altogether less than a half pound-but cost \$3,500 to ship.






