Dahlias Flower More Successfully When Fertilized

Much has been written about fertilizers for the garden and whether it be flowers or vegetables the need is equally important.

However, in the case of the dahlia there seems to be a little variation. With the more experienced growers, the first thought is to have a robust plant. It is only from these good strong plants that he can expect quality blooms, says R. C. Sanders, of the South Central Wisconsin Dahlia society, a consistent blue ribbon winner at the flower shows. The feeding that was done at planting time is intended to carry the young plants over until they reach a budding period or when they are about two feet high.

At that time the plant is given the vitamin that will produce growth and flowers. The dahlia is a gross feeder and a healthy plant can take considerable feed. This feeding is done about the first of August. The formula that has proven very successful is as follows:

Scatter over ground not closer than six inches nor more than 18 inches from the stock and rake in, to every ten hills: 1 1/2 lbs. raw bone meal flour, 1 1/2 lbs. tankage or 4 lbs. sheep manure, not both, 5 lbs. unleached wood ashes or 1/2 lb. muriate of potash, not both.

At this time, for plants that are not doing well, an application of liquid manure will help. Repeat in 10 days.

Spray often enough to keep the plants clean, cultivate carefully and often.

In case of stalkborer, there is no satisfactory insecticidal control at this time. If borer is detected early one may be able to save the plant by slitting the stem and removing borer.

Fall from Train Kills Sailor Leading Madison Recruits

ELKHART, Ind. (UP)—A young sailor, who was killed at Nappanee Thursday in a fall from a passenger train, was identified Saturday as Edward P. Wirtz, Indianapolis.

Identification was made by the victim's father, Edward P. Wirtz, custodian for the Lakewood Catholic school for girls at Indianapolis.

Navy investigators said that Wirtz had been in charge of 17 recruits being sent from Madison, Wis., to Philadelphia when he fell from the train. They said cause of the accident had not been determined.

Wirtz formerly was a teacher and football coach at Roxboro, N. C. He is survived by his wife, Anna, Roxboro.
