MINNEAPOLIS—Bob Kennedy sat rocking his shoelace feet back and forth. He was waiting for a pair of spikes so he could take infield practice with the Naval Air Station team.

"Could we take a minute of your time, Bob?"

"Sure can," said the 22-year-old Chicago White Sox baseball player. And then he cut loose with a smile that exposed a perfect set of teeth.

How about your baseball background?"

"Well, I played three years of semipro ball around Chicago before signing with the White Sox. I was the property of the Sox for two-and-a-half years, before entering the navy."

"Last year I played 27 games in the outfield and 99 at third base. You know, it's a funny thing, but I didn't play baseball in high school. We didn't have a team."

What prep sports did you play?"

"Oh, a little bit of everything else," was the modest reply.

Kennedy played quite a bit of the other sports. It was football in the fall; basketball in the winter and he was a forward on the cage team that captured the national title; and track in the spring.
