### Tenor Schedules Four Melodies For Monday Broadcast; Cavalcade Features Drama Of Air Evacuation Service

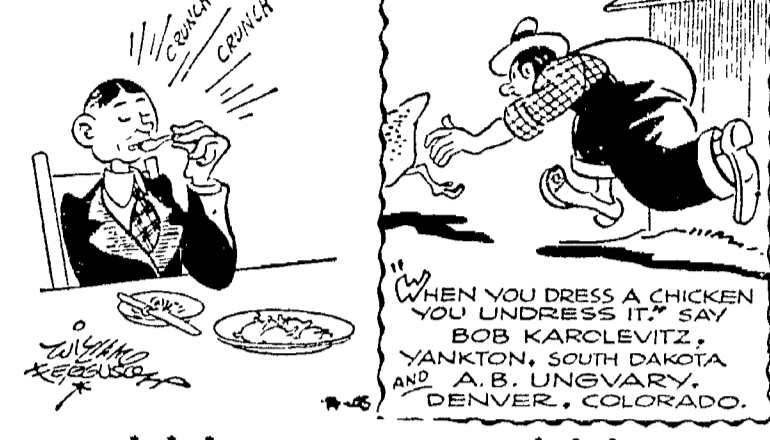

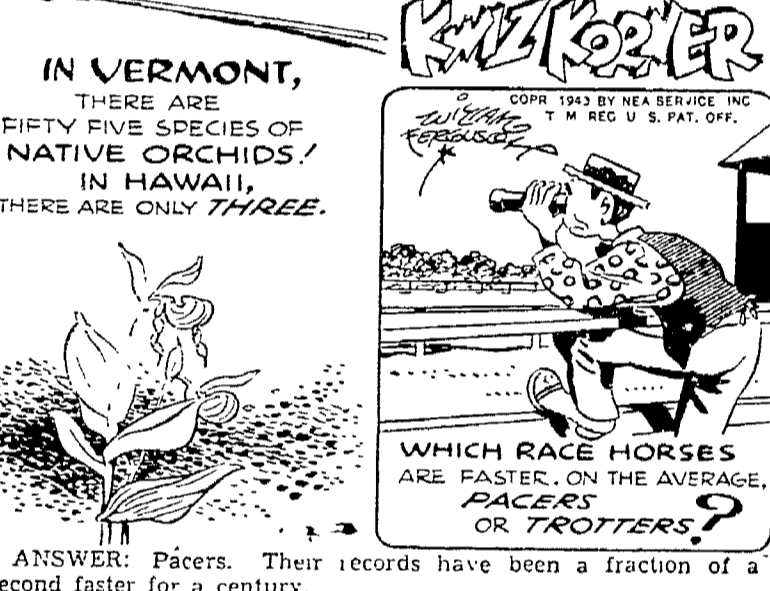

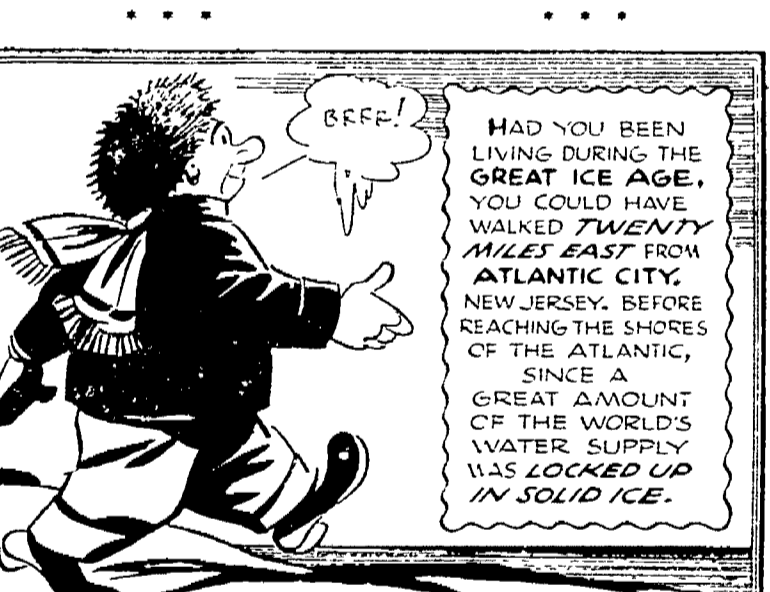
