

'Gone With The Wind' To Play Return Engagement At Ohio

Desert Warfare Picture Showing At Quilna; Story Of Intrigue Coming To Sigma Screen

Because of public demand, "Gone With The Wind," based upon a story written by Margaret Mitchell, will be returned to Lima on Tuesday for the third time and it will be on the screen at the Ohio theatre.

An engrossing, unrelenting story of intrigue played against a tropical background, "Squadron Leader X" coming Wednesday to the Sigma, co-stars Eric Portman and Ann Dvorak at the head of a powerful cast of notable screen and stage favorites.

One of the finest pictures ever made by Joe E. Brown, "The Darling Young Man," comes to the Drive-in theatre on Wednesday.

Roddy McDowall gets into plenty of mischief in "My Friend Flicka" technical picture currently flashing on the screen at the Quilna.

Tuesday and Wednesday will be the final days for the showing of "The Powers Girl," a picture packed with girls, music and romance, at the State.

Being a romantic young man, John Payne's fancy turns to Betty Grable in "Springtime in the Rockies," a rollicking musical also starring Carmen Miranda, Harry James and his music makers and Cesar Romero at the Lyric.

The fact that approximately 52,000,000 people have seen "Gone With The Wind" in its two previous runs around the country, prompted distributors of the David O. Selznick production, now being released for the third time, to investigate just what sort of audiences these 52,000,000 people made up.

Only 34 per cent of the potential audience for the film (on its third national release) is made up of persons who have already seen the picture.

An "abnormally high" proportion (71 per cent) of the persons who now plan to see the picture are occasional, i. e., persons who go to the movies less than once a week.

Approximately 40,254,000 persons over 12 years of age have seen the picture once, while 5,032,000 have seen it two or more times, and 4,77,000 have seen it three or more times.

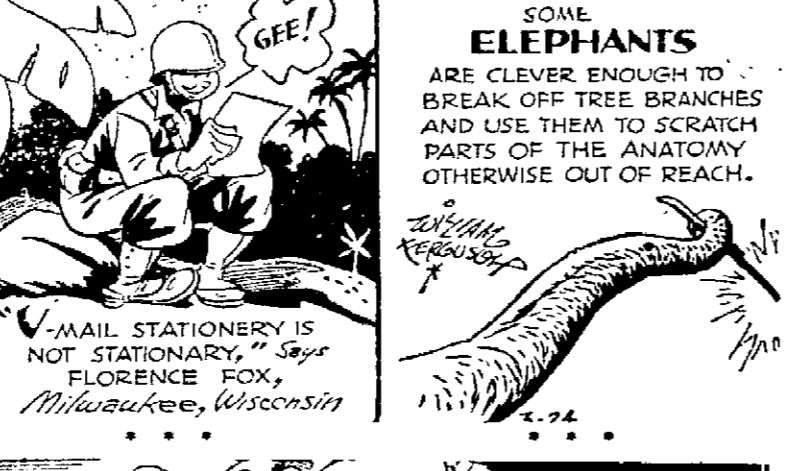

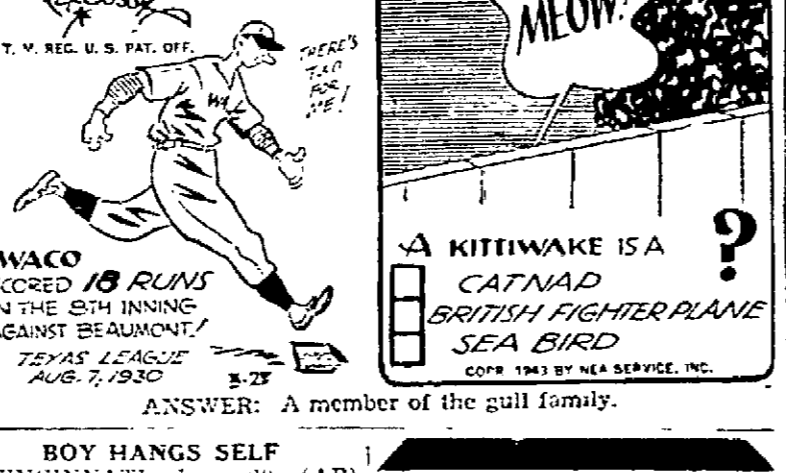
