RETARDING OF HOG SHIPMENTS IS ENDORSED

CHICAGO, July 1—(AP)—Members of the hog production and marketing sections of the advisory committee to the War Meat Board, meeting with the board yesterday, "commended and endorsed" the War Meat Board for requesting and advising hog producers to retard their shipments of hogs to market.

The committee was "fully in accord" with suggestions that hogs should be held on farms and shipped into market in an "orderly way," a war food administration release stated.

It was the opinion of advisory committee members that "the only reason for the recent decline in hog prices has been the inability of packers to slaughter hogs, due to the labor shortage and inadequacy of refrigerating facilities."

RETROACTIVE DATES CHANGED ON WAGE BOOST

CLEVELAND, July 1—(AP)—The Regional War Labor Board today announced an amendment of its decision last week affecting 750 employees of the Savannah and Camden plants of the Tunken Roller Bearing Co., Canton, O.

By unanimous vote, the board made a 5 1/2-cent hourly wage increase retroactive to May 11, 1942, in the case of the Camden plant, and to Feb. 15, 1942, at the Savannah plant, rather than retroactive to Feb. 15, 1943, as provided earlier for both.

The board also announced the appointment of Fred Doude, of St. Marys, as a member of the board, succeeding the late L. H. Steva, who died a week ago at his home near St. Marys. Doude served as speed superintendent for the past four years.
